We wish indeed that the Society and its actions reflect what you are and expect.



#### Dear Colleagues,

It was very good to see so many of you in person in Athens and I hope you made it home safely. In this newsletter I would like to cover some points that may be of interest to you.



The former Constitution of the ECVP was due to a complete overhaul due to legislative changes in the Netherlands where the College is registered. The governance documents were split into Articles of Associations, that

will be require deposition by notarial deed and Bylaws, that may be amended after approval of membership only (but do not require a notarial deed). The membership agreed with great majority to these suggested changes. Both can be found on the website of the ECVP, if you are interested.

A standard training programme is the route followed by most residents who intent to sit the ECVP exam. There was already quite a long time an alternative route to accommodate those residents in a situation that did not allow following a standard training programme. This alternative route has been extended with a modular system next to the individual system. Both need to be applied for and approved individually. Another route to the exam is the one of an internationally recognized specialist. Such a specialist could sit the exam without having followed a residency training programme. The requirements for this route can be found on the EBVS website.

The 2023 edition of the Summer School will be 17-28 of July in Cluj-Napoca, Romania. Those of you who

attended the congress in 2018 will remember this beautiful city and the hospitality of our Romanian colleagues. As usual it will cover various organ systems (gastrointestinal and urinary tract), non-domestic species (reptile, fish, marine mammals) and as a first time for the Summer School New Technologies. There will also be a mock exam for which the same software as in the exam will be used. Registration to the Summer School will be open at some time in spring.

"New technologies" will be also the topic of the Residents'day (30 of August 2023) directly before the next congress from 31 of August until 2 of September 2023 in Lisbon. Thus, there are plenty of opportunities to get to know those techniques used in modern medical research.




ESVP-ECVP-ESVCP-ECVCP – 2023 annual meeting, Lisbon



It is a great honor to join the ESVP board as a councilor. Thank you ESVP for allowing me to bring to the table my diverse background and exposure to both the European and American veterinary




























pathology system to serve the ESVP and contribute to shaping its future.

The French Society of Veterinary Pathology (Société Française d'Anatomie Pathologique Vétérinaire) is a French non-profit association ("association loi de 1901"). It was created in 1962 by Professor André-Laurent Parodi (1933-2022), who was its president from 1967 to 2001, with an inexhaustible desire to offer seminars of high scientific quality. It brings together French and French-speaking veterinary pathologists practicing in France and abroad.

The SFAPV currently has about 100 members in a wide variety of fields: diagnostic, teaching, research as well as pharmaceutical industry. The main objective of the SFAPV is the development of knowledge in the field of spontaneous and experimental animal pathology.

The SFAPV is also concerned with promoting the rapprochement between human and veterinary pathology and encouraging research. The SFAPV also wishes to maintain sustained exchanges with international societies, including the ESVP and the ECVP.

The SFAPV organizes an annual continuing education seminar for an audience of veterinary anatomic pathologists. The annual seminar of the SFAPV focuses on current topics and covers its different aspects: spontaneous animal pathology, comparative pathology, experimental models and research paths, therapeutic actualities (please see the list of seminars on our website: <a href="https://www.sfapv.com/lesseminaires/">https://www.sfapv.com/lesseminaires/</a>).



During the annual seminar, the scientific committee usually invites, in addition to French speakers, one or several speakers of international stature. For example, and among others, in 2019, it received Dr Valérie Freiche (EnvA, Paris, France), Pr Simon Priestnall (Royal Veterinary College, London, UK) and Pr Michael D. Willard (Texas A&M University, USA) for a seminar dedicated to gastrointestinal biopsies and clinicopathological correlations.

Earlier this year, our seminar has been held online with Dr. Rob Foster (University of Guelph, Canada), Dr. Melanie Dobromylskyj (Finn Pathologists, Harleston, UK), Dr. Benoit Riedinger and Dr. Franck Floch (AniCura TRIOVet, Rennes, France) about soft tissue tumors.

For 2023, the annual seminar of the SFAPV will be devoted to oral pathology of companion animals. The final program is currently under development and will

be available on our website in early spring 2023.



The SFAPV is also a partner of the Specialised Veterinary Studies Diploma in anatomical pathology. This Diplôme d'études spécialisées vétérinaires d'Anatomie Pathologique Vétérinaire (DESV) is a postgraduate training organized by the 4 French veterinary schools, which prepares to the examination of the diploma of the European College of Veterinary Pathologists (ECVP).

SFAPV is listed into the French quality certification system DataDock. This means that its training courses meet the criteria defined by the French quality decree n°2015-790 and that its training courses are eligible for French professional training and continuing education funding. All these activities are carried out by volunteers.
